
Students have been impressing staff with their efforts in cooking this week.

As we approach the end of term we wanted to celebrate our enrichment programme and the incredible levels of engagement across our year groups. 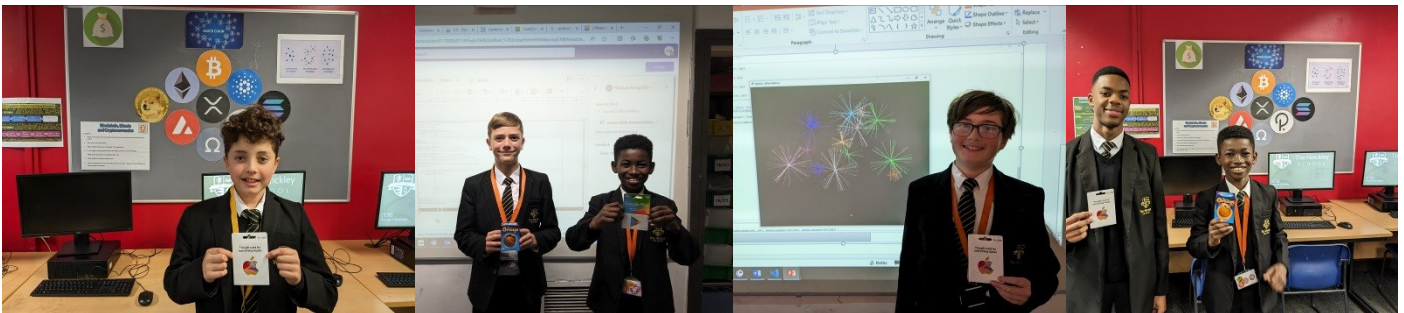


Programming Challenge with Mr Holmes -

In its initial year, the Programming Challenges have provided students with the opportunity to enhance their coding skills in line with the school's vision to become a Computer Science hub for the county. I have to say that the students involvement and desire to take part in the fortnightly challenges has been outstanding and I truly believe that we have some brilliant logical thinkers and programmers at our school!

Students have produced word games, typing speed tests and graphical displays to name a few, all using the Python programming language. Winners each fortnight have produced outstanding work and fully deserve their £10 Apple or Google store vouchers.

Geology & Palaeontology with Mr Gadbsy -

Students have watched all of Walking with Monsters - a documentary covering the Cambrian to the Triassic periods, learning about life before the dinosaurs. They have also been looking at the differences between sedimentary, metamorphic, and igneous rocks, as well as fossils from the Devonian to the Jurassic. Well done everyone!

Wildlife Club with Mrs Mason-

Many students have enjoyed the Wildlife Club. We purchased a bird feeder which is filled up each session with seeds, fat balls and sometimes fruit. The students love to become involved with this and enjoy watch the birds and squirrels from some of the classrooms in The Bridge. Students have also made a small wildlife pond with stepping stones and sticks in to enable creatures such as frogs to access water. We are hoping for some tadpoles in the Spring. We have a bug hotel and a small hay filled box for small animals to use for shelter. No activity has been seen in here yet but we still hoping something will take up residence! We have talked about the different birds which are spotted on the bird feeder. There is an abundance of wildlife around the school being so close to the golf club and having woodland nearby too. In the Spring, we are hoping to install bird boxes on the school and also to purchase another bird feeder with anti-squirrel feeders!

CELEBRATING ENRICHMENT - MATILDA

Matilda rehearsals are in full swing and the cast are working so hard to ensure that this show is the high quality that we've come to know and love here at The Hinckley School.

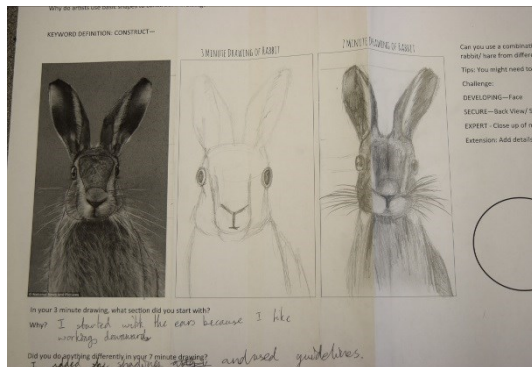
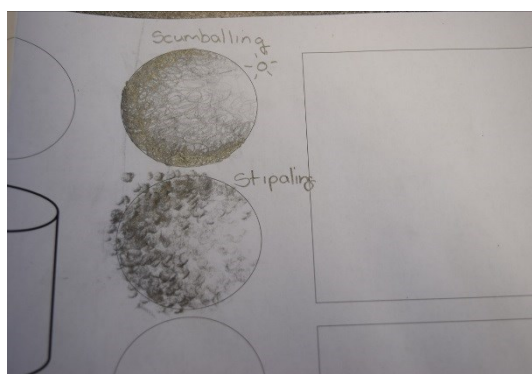
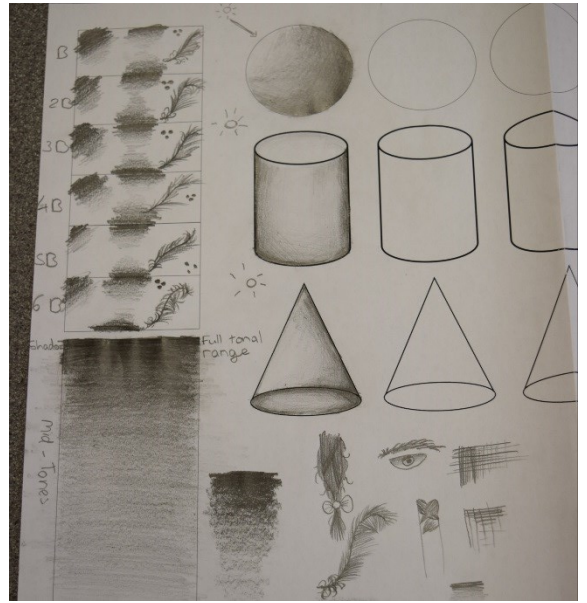

This academic year, The Hinckley School will be entering and competing in the Art Bytes competition; Raising aspirations for better futures by championing the creativity of the nation's next generation, using art and virtual technology. Art Bytes is a national EdTech programme that utilises a bespoke, immersive, virtual gallery incorporating augmented reality elements, to give young participants the opportunity to see their art exhibited online and engage with new technology from the safety and convenience of their own home or school. After a shortlisting panel and an online public vote, the winning artist from each school sees their work displayed in our virtual gallery. Art Bytes culminates every June with a celebration event at a high-profile cultural venue in each of the nine regions of England, which is also available to schools to stream in the classroom or assembly. Regional winners are announced, certificates and prizes are presented, and the virtual gallery goes live. Miss Webster is looking for submissions of artwork from 30 of our fantastically creative and innovative students to enter into the national competition. The deadline is February half-term 2024.

When submitting work, key things to note:

- **Artwork created by Year 9 students in this academic year, whether at home or in school, is eligible.**
- **One entry per student.**
- **No set theme, allowing students to express themselves as they wish through their artwork**
- **Artwork in any fine art medium or technique is acceptable, rather than textiles/design.**
- **2D or 3D artwork (please note all 3D work entries will be exhibited as a photograph).**
- **Artworks created at home should be made without parents or guardians help.**

We will of course keep you up to date with entries submitted (with photographs of artwork in our newsletter) and will provide information regarding the vote once the submission window is closed. For further information please speak to Miss Webster.
