# E Safety

There will be E Safety assemblies delivered across the year groups by the Safeguarding Team this academic year and in these assemblies, we will focus on the online issues our children face the most and how they can better look after themselves online.











One of the biggest issues is that many children are accessing social media and websites that are designed for older children and in some cases adults and the way children get round this is to lie about their age, but it's often not a lie that just gets them past the requirement, e.g. age limit is 15 the child will state they are 18, so not only removing any protections that are there for children but the website will then view the child as an adult with no filtering of any kind.

Instagram have introduced Instagram Teen Accounts which have built-in protections for teens which should give parents more peace of mind if their teenagers are accessing Instagram in this way. The Teen Account will limit who can contact them, filter the content they can see and the Teen Account will need a parent's permission to change any of the in-built protections.

#### **CEOP = Child exploitation online protection**

# **External Safeguarding Audit**

Alongside all other schools in The Futures Trust, we benefit from taking part in an annual external safeguarding audit and it was our turn on the 7th November. We are pleased and proud to report that the auditor gave us some wonderful feedback on the assessment of our safeguarding provision. Many strengths were noted and staff and student feedback was very positive, with a particular emphasis on the training we offer and the understanding that gives both staff and students on all aspects of safeguarding. We strive every day to ensure we offer a safe and nurturing environment for all our students and staff and it was lovely for this to be recognised by an independent specialist.

### New for the New Year!

The Hinckley and Bosworth Borough council have offered us an Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) to deliver an 8- week Wellbeing course, one hour a week.

Part mental health topic, part exercise activity, with 15 students per group, this course is for students with low level mental health concerns. The course aims to boost confidence and improve self-esteem. Students will learn the tools to improve their mental health, understand where to go when they need help with their mental health and will become Positivity Ambassadors for the school, passing on the skills they have learnt to others.

The group leader will be training our own staff to carry this on after Easter.

In addition, we are also receiving:

ELSA – Emotional Literacy Support Assistant – 1:1 support in school, half an hour sessions for 6-8 weeks.

# Victim First and Support for Young People



Referrals can be made to Victim First for children and young people, under 13's will need consent from a parent/carer. They also accept referrals for a parent if they are unsure if their child would like to take up help.

It's all confidential unless a safeguarding issue presents or the child/young person wants it to be shared with a parent/carer. Support will not go ahead unless the young person has confirmed that this is what they want to do.

Average timescale for support tends to be between 1-3 months but it can be longer. The incidents could have happened a long time ago as well, it doesn't need to be recent.

With younger children they tend to meet face to face in schools and older children can range from face to face, email, text, telephone, zoom etc

They can support victims of ASB, bullying, exploitation etc and witnesses who feel impacted by an incident. They also have access to a hardship fund to help young people with their recovery. They can't support medium or high risk domestic abuse cases.

# Warm Homes Information – Leicestershire County Council public health

Leicestershire County Council's Warm Homes service provides advice to residents to support affordable warmth. Residents can obtain advice by telephoning 0116 305 2524 or by visiting the advice pages here: www.leicestershire.gov.uk/home-energy-grants

The service is currently delivering two projects:

- Home Energy Retrofit Offer Eligible residents living in energy inefficient homes can receive tailored support, via home visits, to access grant funding or assess their homes to identify suitable improvements. The scheme aims to support residents to have the knowledge and confidence to improve their homes, affordable warmth and curt carbon emissions. The service will be promoting retrofit of homes and providing advice at events across the county through to March 2025. Eligible residents could receive free home assessments to identify improvements and access grant funded scheme. - Home Upgrade Grant The Home Upgrade Grant administered by the Warm Homes service together with YES energy Solutions and E.ON Energy Solutions can provide homeowners and private tenants (subject to landlord contribution) with fully funded energy efficiency measures improving the warmth and comfort of homes, whilst also reducing energy bills, carbon emissions and levels of fuel poverty across the county. The scheme supports households that do not have mains gas as a primary heating system, such as those with electric, oil, LPG or solid fuel heating. Households that only use gas for cooking or secondary room heating can still apply. As the scheme enters its second year the income eligibility threshold has been increased reflecting the higher cost of living on household finances.
