
#### A Shakespearean Day Out

Last Thursday, Year 12 and 13 English Literature students were treated to a Shakespearean day out. After arriving in Stratford in the glorious spring sunshine, students were given time to explore the town (and purchase those all important souvenirs!) Our first appointment was at Shakespeare's Birthplace Museum, where we learned about Shakespeare's childhood, schooling, and his father's trade as a glovemaker. Students enjoyed dressing up in theatrical costume and posing for photos! After that, we had some more time to explore Stratford in the sunshine before having an academic lecture from an RSC expert. She was very impressed with the contributions from the students, especially their knowledge of the play and thoughtful opinions about the possible staging of Hamlet.

We then moved on to the main event: the RSC production of Hamlet, which has been getting rave reviews in the national press. The production was breath-taking, with all the action taking place on a tilting ship, which the students agreed was an innovative spin on Shakespeare's vision. - *Mrs Foers, Head of English* 











#### 'THANK YOU' FROM THE HINCKLEY FOODBANK



We have been delighted to receive an email from Jim Matthews, who collected our foodbank donations on behalf of Hinckley Area Foodbank, to share more information about the impact of our 'sizeable' donation:

- Donation weight 279.8kg
- The monetary value is equivalent to £775.77
- This is equivalent to providing approximately 650 meals
- Based on the usual 3-day emergency provision for a single person, this would therefore meet the needs of 72 people

Jim Matthews called our students 'enthusiastic' and 'helpful' and thanked our entire school community for showing such heart and generosity.

#### Blood Brothers Drama Workshop



Drama students across year 9 to 11 had an exceptional experience this week, when they took part in a 'Blood Brothers' masterclass with London based 'Stage Ed ' theatre company. Mike and Steve who played Sammy and Mickey in the West End production of Blood Brothers for over ten years, shared their expertise, passion and deep knowledge of the play with the students and navigated the workshop to help the year 10/11 students with their written paper and introduced Year 9 to the GCSE journey in Drama. The Drama Studio was buzzing with excitement all day as the students explored different scenes, context, themes and characters in the play and watched a fantastic performance of the iconic monologue ' I Wish I was Our Sammy'.

Maths teacher, Mr Hall, was delighted by the experience when he popped in, sharing his love of Blood Brothers and the theatre. It is wonderful for Core subjects to show their enjoyment of the arts and have the opportunity to see students shine in a different context. He said, "Having watched Blood Brothers myself I could see that the students were clearly enjoying their interactions and activities and really warmed to being put through their paces. This served as true motivation and inspiration for our students to proceed into a career on stage."

Mrs Cook, Head of Drama was thrilled with the feedback from Stage Ed who said that students from The Hinckley School were amongst the best they had worked with. She said, 'such a fantastic opportunity for our GCSE Drama students today, bringing Blood Brothers to life with this workshop, giving the students a great understanding of the play for their theory exam.
