PLANNED HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT

PLANNED HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT WORKS, HINCKLEY (Traffic Signal Junction Upgrade) – Hollier's Walk, Derby Road, New Buildings & Leicester Road signalised junction.

I am writing to advise that Leicestershire County Council will be undertaking works to upgrade the traffic signalised junction at the above location. The works include new LED traffic signal heads using extra-low voltage equipment and an improved junction design to allow safer traffic and pedestrian movements. We will also take the opportunity of resurfacing the junction as part of these works.

The new scheme layout is shown on the attached Plan A

Scheme benefits include

- Improved traffic flow, New efficient signalling, Reduced journey and waiting times,
- Improved junction capacity,
- Shortened pedestrian crossings
- New safe and efficient diagonal crossing point with 'on-crossing' detection, extending the areen time, where needed
- Widened footway areas, Advance cycle stop-line

The works will start Monday 20th January 2025 and will last for approximately 13 weeks. To ensure safety and efficiency, we will be using a combination of temporary road closures (as required) and multi-way temporary traffic signals.

The extent of the road closures will include Derby Road (from its junctions with Hollier's Walk to Alma Road) and New Buildings (from its junctions with Leicester Road southwards towards the entrance to Aldi). A Plan showing the closures and diversion routes required during the works as well as other supporting information is shown on the project website, listed below.

Access to premises will be maintained as much as possible, however there may be short periods of restrictions, which will be managed and minimised where possible.
















BIRMINGHAM CHRISTMAS MARKET - KS4 REWARD TRIP


