## THE FUTURES TRUST ARTS FESTIVAL



This first ever Futures Trust Arts Festival was a truly unique event which saw fifteen students from The Hinckley School meet leading lights in the arts, including poets, authors, actors and artists, as well as working with their peers from our sister schools within The Futures Trust in a vibrant celebration of the Arts. Organised by Barr's Hill, it was a perfect example of the unique opportunities being part of The Futures Trust family brings for our community.

Ms Crisp our Librarian said, "It was such an amazing once in a lifetime experience for the students and very special to observe friendships develop between the different schools and different age groups. The theatre at 'Fargo Village' 'The Box' was filled to the rafters with parents and staff coming to watch the performance as a culmination of three days of workshops. The show was incredibly powerful and emotional, with all three art forms coming together on stage with their interpretations of what the poem 'Flag' by John Agard meant to them. It was a privilege to be able to be a part of this project."

Mrs Cook, Head of Performing Arts, has shared how truly inspirational the event was, commenting, "This was such a unique experience for the students, to really champion and celebrate their interest and passion for the arts whilst working with some truly inspirational practitioners. It was great to meet students from our trust schools and our work together has forged some important connections for future collaborations. Thank you to Marlow for channelling his creativity for such a good cause.




### KS3 ART COMPETITION - HAVE YOU ENTERED?

Student Saver tickets are available for anyone aged 16+ in full time education.

To ensure you get your saver ticket in time for the start of the new academic year, you can register for this ticket now but set your payments to commence after the summer. Once we have received your first payment, your ticket will be sent to you, then you won't need to worry about your child paying for tickets on the bus. You can choose to receive the ticket by post or if you download the Arriva UK bus app onto the ticket holders' phone and we can send an m-ticket to their app instead.
