Incredible Memories for Iceland Adventurers





During October half term, staff and forty nine students from The Hinckley School took part in a once in a lifetime trip to Iceland.

"When we arrived, the students were in awe of the volcanoes, the stunning scenery depicting the glaciers and the mountainous landscape. To start off our adventure we had a guided tour in Reykjavik, the capital of Iceland, on our first day. The tour saw us spend time exploring the famous Hallgrimskirkja church and taking a look at the Harpa Concert Hall.

The next day saw the students take part in the Golden Circle Tour, providing a fascinating insight into the National Parks and physical features of the country. We saw the Gullfoss waterfall, Geysir geothermal area, Pingvellir fissure and more. The students, and staff, couldn't believe the beauty of these majestic sights and were amazed more was to come. At the end of the tour, we took a dip in the Secret Lagoon, a naturally heated body of water created by the tectonic activity. We couldn't believe the temperatures it rose to but the smell could have been given a miss!

The following day saw us complete the South Shore tour visiting the LAVA centre, the Reynisfjara black sandy beaches and the Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls. Although the weather could have been better, this didn't stop the students chasing the waves on the Atlantic coast. After action packed daytime adventures, each evening gave us the opportunity to soak in the Reykjavik atmosphere, visiting local shops and indulging in the local cuisine.

All of the students had an incredible time and I just want to say a massive thank you to the students for their incredible conduct and thank you to the staff for all their hard work.

We will be going again very soon and maybe we will see you there!"

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
Announcing Our PE Partnership with BodyWize

We are delighted to announce that our PE department have secured a joint partnership with the BodyWize Gym in Hinckley. This partnership will see all Year 10 PE core students take part in one gym session per fortnight at BodyWize, where students can work independently on their own physical development with expert professionals on hand to support individual training needs.

Mr Barnacle, Head of PE said, "As a school we recognise the increasing demands and environmental factors that affect our students as they move through their GCSE's and we as a department want to provide a safe space where students can exercise and promote a lifelong love for the style of physical activity that many adults use to balance working and de-stressing."

Students were challenged to 'Escape Year 11' this week as part of The Hinckley Sixth Form's 2024 Escape Room.

A two part event which took place during Wednesday and Thursday registration, Year 11 students worked in teams within their tutor groups to crack cyphers, solve riddles, hunt for clues and complete maths challenges. Students worked in their tutor rooms during the first event and had to solve three puzzles to 'escape' Year 11 and progress to the next day of puzzles over in our dedicated Sixth Form building which was decorated with a Halloween theme for the occasion.



Answers and clues were all based around destinations and post 16 decision making, but with a spooky twist, and linked back to the information shared about The Hinckley Sixth Form during our recent assembly. The fastest three teams to complete the escape room received a prize and staff were impressed by Year 11's logical thinking, team work and resilience.

The Sixth Form team now look forward to welcoming Year 11 students to their Open Evening on Wednesday 6th November.
