Sculptural Lighting in 3D Design







After investigating the work of photographer Mo Devlin, who captures close-up photographs of flowers frozen in blocks of ice, Year 11 3D Design student Marlow began to explore how he could utilise this as a source of inspiration to design and develop a lamp/ lighting device.

After initial experimentation with expoxy resin, Marlow challenged himself to adapt the process to produce an illuminated structure that shared visual similarities to the work of his inspirational sources.

Throughout the process Marlow has demonstrated PRIDE, most evidently through the resilience shown as he reflected on obstacles, modifying his design in response.

SILVER DOFE NAVIGATE WAKELEY WOODS




